Cohesion Policy¹ and the IPA programme² have received a new regulatory framework. ENI has replaced ENPI³. The new regulatory frameworks mean a review of overall objectives, support priorities, but also a review of the methods for programming and implementation. Our key question: What are the key novelties and support priorities for each instrument? What is the role of regional and territorial development in CP, IPA and ENI now? The guiding question will be: What practical perspectives are opened up to countries in overcoming regional disparities? The local perspective of regional development: Part one: Territorial instruments in regional policy	 The success of regional development policies very much depend on the ability of the state to build an efficient system of multilevel governance and partnership which gives the opportunity to combine locally rooted assets and potentials with know-how and resources coming from central or regional levels. Experiences from many European countries show that building of multilevel governance systems which empower local communities can be supported by special types of instruments taking into account multidimensional territorial strategies and action plan. The local perspective of regional development: Part two: Local governments and institutions in regional policy	 Experiences across European Union, Balkan and Eastern Partnership countries show that efficiency of any territorially oriented policy depends on the quality and strengths of interactions between self-governments and other supporting institutions like development agencies, business centres etc. Furthermore, local governments are part of the broader multilevel governance structures whose efficiency as a whole will determine the growth performance of a given territory. The second part of the session is devoted to discussion about the role and ways of improvement of the quality of local governments and other institutions in fostering the growth and development in local and regional scales: How can local governments formulate viable objectives, link up with national policies and donor programmes? What sort of support and preparation do they need in order to become effective agents of change? Why is the involvement of local governments important for overcoming regional disparities?
